COVID-19 Public Notice

UPDATE (May 21,2021) - The Center for Natural Lands Management (CNLM) is further reopening their Dana Point Preserve Trail for public access. CNLM will close or further restrict trail access if COVID-19 conditions worsen or there are unsafe conditions created onsite, including lack of compliance with trail use guidelines and regulations.

The current and ongoing health crisis has demanded that Preserve access and trail use requirements be changed from previous norms to reflect the new environment in which we operate. As Federal, State, and local restrictions continue to be lifted, CNLM is updating our trail access guidelines to offer more opportunities for the public to visit CNLM's Dana Point Preserve. Before entering the trail, please read the updates and expected timeline below.

Commencing Tuesday May 25, 2021 CNLM's Dana Point Preserve Trail will be Two-Way use. The trail is currently open to the public Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday 08:00 AM - 12:00 PM.

Commencing Tuesday June 8, 2021 CNLM's Dana Point Preserve Trail will be open to the public:

COVID-19 visitor rules while on the CNLM Dana Point Preserve:

- **Do not enter if you are sick or have been in contact with individuals that have been sick.**
- **The trail is now Two-Way Trail use.**
- **No large group recreation.**
- **No gathering or stopping along the trail.**
- **If a trail or trailhead is crowded, choose not to walk.**

In addition, a portion of the trail is designated a quiet zone. Please be respectful of the wildlife and remain quiet in this section of the trail. Signs will be posted designating the start and end of the zone.

CNLM staff and volunteers have authority to refuse entrance to or require any visitors not in compliance to leave. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding during this time as we move towards further reopening the CNLM Dana Point Preserve Trail.
